

<b>Problems with Articles of Confederation</b>	<b>Solution</b>
No courts	Power to create courts
No way of enforcing orders on either individuals or on states	Could enforce laws with an army or police force
Could not levy taxes	Authority to collect taxes
Every decision had to be unanimous	Bills and other decisions pass through 2/3 of the house and senate
No army	Only the national government could raise and maintain an army
Could not regulate trade	Could regulate commerce within states and with other countries
Awkward and very inefficient way of representation	2 Houses for representation: Senate, which required 2 senators from each state, and the House of Representatives, which gave each state 1 representative per 30,000 people.
Treaties with only unanimous agreement among the states	Power to make treaties
Could not coin its own money, states had individual currency	Power to coin money, power to individual currency from the states revoked
